2. Critical Thinking

Students will develop the necessary skills to think critically.

Operational definition: to think critically is defined as the intellectual process of analyzing, applying, synthesizing and/or evaluating information collected and/or generated through observation, experience, reflection, reasoning, or communication so as to reach an antewer, m a prediction, or draw a conclusion.

3. Communication

Students will be able to communicate effectively.

Operational definition: communicate effectively is defined as the ability to conveyaning (either verbally or in writing) to a particular audience.

4. Global Citizenship

Students will develop as global citizens.

Operational definition: develop as global citizens means that the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and actions associated with being a Globally Positioned Sthident. includes, but is not limited to, the development of the cultural competencies necessar engaging the multiplicity of human perspectives and differences with authentic empathy.

5. Civic Engagement/Social Responsibility

Students will demonstrate socially responsible behavior and engagement.

Operational definition: social responsibility and "civic engagement" together reflexating and/or participating in events that address issues of public concern, so as to benefit society at large A necessary aspect of acting in a socially responsible manner and/or participating in civic engagement involves demonstrating and adhering to moral and ethical principles, especially those associated with the Sinsinawa Dominican tradition.

6. Integrative/Interdisciplinarlynquiry*

Students will have the knowledge of and the ability to conduct **atteg** interdisciplinary inquiry.

Operational definition: integrative/interdisciplinary inquiry is defined as the process of combining information experiences, data, techniques, tools, perspectives, concepts, and/or theories from across different contex

7. Research and Scholarship

Student will have the knowledge base and skill set necessary for condestinage and/or scholarship in a particular area of study.

Operational definition: "research and/or scholarship" is defined has systematic implementation of intellectual inquiry to advance the knowledge base of a particular field of study and the dissemination of this knowledge through either publications or presentations.
